#### Winter coats

Please ensure your child has **a nice warm coat with a hood for school**. Children require the additional warmth of a winter coat.

**Hats, scarves, gloves and umbrellas <u>not appropriate</u> for school**. Hats, scarves and gloves go missing and also restrict a child's ability to play outdoors. Once the gloves get wet outside, they actually make the child feel colder and uncomfortable. Let me reassure you that in very cold weather, children will spend only very short periods of time outdoors with lots of opportunities to warm themselves up indoors.

#### Attendance and Timekeeping:

This is the time of year when children pick up bugs. If your child is too poorly sick to come to school, the best place for them is at home resting. This allows them to make a swift recovery and prevents the spread of illness to other children.

Please ring the school office and let Joanne Jones know that they won't be in **on the first day of absence**. As a maintained nursery school, we follow the safeguarding procedures and policies of Liverpool City Council. As such, any **unexplained absences may be followed up as a safeguarding concern.**

#### **NELI Nursery Rhyme**

Next week, our rhyme will be "Jack and Jill" Each day, children will focus on a Special Word to develop and extend their vocabulary. Our Special Words next week are:

- hill
- broke
- tumble
- after













At home, you can support your child's learning by **using these words often in sentences**. For example, you might talk to your child about the word 'tumble' and show them how the tumble dryer turns the washing over and over and say "look at the tumble dryer. The washing is tumbling over inside the drum. That's why it's called a tumble dryer".

### **Nativity Performances**

Before the children's nativity performances, you are invited to come and join us for a **mince pie**, **tea and coffee**. The actual performances will start at 9.30am (morning) or 2pm (afternoons). Refreshments will be available from 8.30am and 1.30pm.

The nativity performances take place in classrooms, where space is limited. Where two showings are offered, we request that families spread their attendance over the morning and afternoon. We will need to limit the audience to **2 family members per showing**. Thank you for your consideration.

#### Children's Christmas Party Days

Please note that your child only attends school for **one** of the party days. On the alternate day, they do not attend school.
