Happy Friday everyone!

What a busy week it has been in school. Our theme this half term is "Once Upon a time". Children will be reading and learning about traditional stories, such as the Gingerbread Man, Rumpelstiltskin and The Three Billy Goats Gruff.

You can support your child's learning at home by reading traditional stories to your child and talking about the characters and things that happen in the story. Ask your child to tell you what happened in the story. Once they know a story well, **encourage them to tell you the story** using the pictures in the book to help them remember what happened.

Chinese New Year dragon show

To mark the start of our 2025 Chinese New Year celebrations, the dragon dancers will be visiting school. Parents are warmly invited at **10.30am or 12.15pm on Monday 27th January** to come and see the amazing show, which has become an annual traditional at EPR. The show lasts about 30 minutes. Access for parents will be via the carpark gate.

As you can appreciate, this is a costly show to put on each year. We are asking parents for **a small voluntary contribution of £2.00** towards the cost of putting on this show, which we will be taking on the day.

Effect of i-pads, tablets and mobile phones on children's language

Studies are increasingly evidencing the **negative impact** of extended use of digital devices on children's development, especially in terms of attention span, language and communication. As a maximum, **30 minutes of use** is the limit for children at the age of 3 and 4. **This is the total time for a whole day**.

Children do not learn new words or language from screens. Language is about communicating socially and requires two-way conversations with another human being. The best way to promote language is through natural conversations with an adult, turn taking, or sharing a book together and talking about what is happening in the story. Encourage eye contact, paying attention and being fully present in the moment. Nursery rhymes with actions are also the absolute foundation for young children's language development (but only when they are sung by an adult, not when they are viewed on a screen).

Stoneycroft Children's Centre

Our extended provision manager, Carolina (Cal) Thompson, has been developing a partnership with our local children's centre, which provides a range of services for children and families. With the ever increasing challenges of modern life, the children's centre **offers support for parents and families**. Examples of courses they offer are relationships, toilet training, nutrition, sleep and financial planning.

Cal has provided a **Membership Form** and an information flyer containing details of classes available for this term through the children's centre. Please return completed membership forms to your child's class teacher in school **by this Friday (24th January)** and we will pass these on to Stoneycroft Children's Centre.
